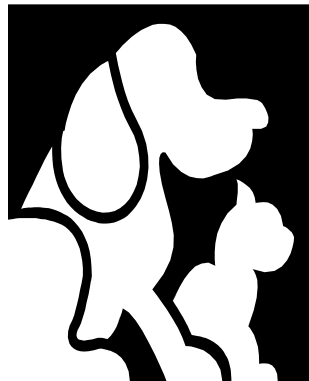

Surgery may be rescheduled for the following reasons:

- Overweight
- Underweight
- Under 3 months or 3 pounds
- Runny eyes or nose
- Skin infection
- Late term pregnancy
- Mammary development
- Failure to fast overnight
- On certain medications
- Any other medical issue the veterinarian determines to be unsafe



Important Pre-operative Instructions:

Any animal age 5 months or older, must be fasted overnight.

Please take food away no later than midnight the night before surgery. This includes ALL FOOD including treats.

Access to water is permitted

Be sure to keep the animal inside the night before surgery to assure he/she has not had access to anything ingestible.

All animals must come in a plastic "vari-kennel", no wire crates or soft sided carriers are permitted for the safety of the animals.

Please do not send collars, leashes, blankets, toys, etc. with the pet.

Be sure that your animal is tab-banded (provided at check in) and their carrier is labeled with the pets name and your last name (tape at check in if needed).

Important Post-operative Instructions:

Be sure to keep your pet in a dry and quiet area following surgery, and keep them calm.

No running, jumping, playing, swimming or other strenuous activity for 7-10 days.

No Baths during recovery

Dogs need to be walked on a leash when going out to potty.

Be sure that your pet is not licking or chewing at the incision site. HOPE recommends e-collars (\$8.56) be purchased for each patient to ensure the site is not licked open.

Check the incision site twice daily. There should be no discharge or bleeding, redness and swelling should be minimal.

Appetite should return within 24hours.

Do not change your pets diet during the recovery period.

All pets receive a small tattoo, 1/2" line, with green ink. This is to identify the pet as spayed or neutered and prevent any unnecessary surgery.
